The overall aim of LEAD-Mexico's Cohort Training Program is to provide a platform for developing a network of leaders with a sound understanding of sustainable development goals and environmental challenges Mexico and the world are facing. Our specific objectives will be to:

- a. Assess the nature and scope of environmental challenges;
- b. Find integrated, comprehensive solutions to complex resource and environmental problems that involve trans-boundary and regional issues, as well as explore strategies for optimum natural resource use and management; and
- c. Suggest improvements in natural resource governance and environmental politics and policy.



LEAD-Mexico Methodology: Learning by Doing

LEAD-Mexico's headquarters are located in one of the most prestigious educational institutions in Mexico: El Colegio de México. Our training approach focuses on developing both practical skills and a solid academic background. The methods used by LEAD-Mexico include interactive presentations and discussions with well-known national and international government officials, the media, representatives of the private sector, and distinguished scholars; case studies; experiential learning; simulations and role-playing; e-learning modules and homework; and a final group project. A portion of the training is conducted in the field. LEAD Associates are taken on "site visits" where they witness real-life involvement in sustainable development issues and interact with different stakeholders.
